Our education work supports artistic and personal development, increases wellbeing and attainment and is a benchmark for creative learning.

Linden Hall Studio is delighted to present an exhibition of works by the members of the SWA, featuring a spread of styles across the entire visual language.

The Society of Women Artists (SWA) is a British art body, and has had a unique history dedicated to promoting art by women. It was founded as the Society of Female Artists (SFA) in about 1855, offering women artists the opportunity to exhibit and sell their works which they had otherwise been denied. Annual exhibitions have been held in London since 1857. The Society enjoys royal patronage from HRH Princess Michael of Kent.

The society has had many notable artists among its members. Dame Laura Knight, the first woman Royal Academician, was elected president in 1932 and retained that office until she retired in 1968 to become a Patron. Membership of the SWA is composed of a maximum of 150 members. They promote new artists and encourage non-members to show their work at their annual exhibition.



Sister and Brother in Music: Fanny and Felix Mendelssohn

Christopher Cook

If Felix Mendelssohn was precocious as a composer, then his sister Fanny was equally gifted, acting as his principal artistic advisor. It is only recently that we have come to appreciate Fanny's gifts as a musician with over 500 compositions, many of which are still awaiting publication and performance. And if the brother prospered in the wider European world as a composer and a conductor, his sister created a lively and admired music scene in her Berlin salon, a place to be seen and to hear new music.

Brother and sister, both beneficiaries of a desire amongst educated Jews to assimilate into German cultural life, became important composers and conductors remaining deeply devoted to each other throughout their lives, Felix never fully recovered from Fanny's death in 1847, dying only months later.

Christopher Cook explores the world that shaped these two remarkable musical lives and reflects on the obstacles that faced Fanny as a woman striving to create her own musical identity.

Philippa Gregory is one of the world's foremost historical novelists. She wrote her first ever novel, *Wideacre*, when she was completing her PhD in eighteenth-century literature, and it sold worldwide, heralding a new era for historical fiction. Her flair for blending history and imagination developed into a signature style and Philippa went on to write many bestselling novels, including *The Other Boleyn Girl* and *The White Queen*. Now a recognised authority on women's history, Philippa is a member of the Society of Authors and in 2016, was presented with the Outstanding Contribution to Historical Fiction Award by the Historical Writers' Association. In 2018, she was awarded Neilsen's Honorary Platinum Award by for achieving significant lifetime sales across her entire book output.



LONDON MOZART PLAYERS

The London Mozart Players, the UK’s longest established chamber orchestra, celebrated its 70th birthday last year. It is one of the finest chamber orchestras in the world and tonight is joined by soloist Jess Gillam, one of the most celebrated musicians of her generation. She is well known for her work on BBC TV and Radio, being the youngest ever BBC music presenter. Jess was soloist at The Last Night of The Proms 2018. She records exclusively for Decca Classics and first came to attention when she was the first ever saxophonist to reach the Final of BBC Young Musician of the Year. She was the recipient of a Classic Brit Award in the Sound of Classical Poll 2018 which promotes the best emerging artists and ‘ones-to-watch’ in classical music.
