



In 1957 the Beat artists and writers converged on a small hotel in Paris and a young English photographer, Harold Chapman, became the great chronicler of the Beat Hotel and its legendary inhabitants. When the hotel closed in the 60s, Chapman moved on but his work has continued, to this day, to attract worldwide attention and acclaim, characterised by pervasive moody anxiety and quirky wit.
