Introduction from our Artistic Director Paul Max Edlin



Well, it's happening! Yes, the last year has been exceptional for us all, and it has certainly presented all arts organisations with unprecedented challenges. But we are still here, and we are raring to go! DMA Festival 2021 will be one of the first U.K. festivals to take place.

This year's programme will feel rather more intimate than some recent ones; it is purely because we have needed to be extra cautious. We want to make sure our festival can happen and you can all enjoy it, engage with it, be stimulated and inspired by it – and feel safe!

The circumstances of this year have enabled us to be bold too. For instance, we present a series of three concerts that allow us to hear all Beethoven's violin sonatas in the order in which they were composed. Has that been done before? Perhaps, but I don't know where or when.

We are naturally thrilled that we are providing special opportunities for some of our nation's most talented young musicians – who so desperately deserve it. For the phenomenal musicians of The Purcell School to be performing alongside Nicholas Daniel OBE is hugely meaningful to them and to us. For the Academy of Ancient Music to be performing alongside students from Guildhall is equally important. Finally, to be presenting our beloved NYJO (National Youth Jazz Orchestra) in two special concerts, one in which they work with British jazz legends Norma Winstone MBE and Nikki Iles is terrific and exciting. But please note these are the first live concerts NYJO are giving since last year's March lockdowns. How proud we are in Deal to be ensuring this piece of jazz music history is possible!

We hope you can enjoy live art once again, in turn supporting our great artists who have been deprived of live performing platforms for so long. Now is a time we can start to celebrate the importance and value of the Arts – together!

The Acts will include the Andy Wall Trio, and Antique Roadshow, and members of the National Youth Jazz Orchestra.

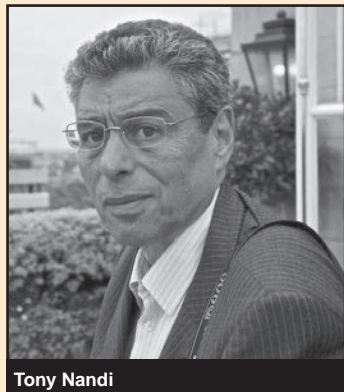

LEARNING & PARTICIPATION WITH DEAL MUSIC & ARTS

Each year Deal Music & Arts works with people of all ages across East Kent to deliver outstanding education work, in cooperation with regional and national partners. Our education work supports artistic and personal development, increases wellbeing and attainment and is a benchmark for creative learning.

Covid-19 brought all our education programmes to an abrupt halt but we quickly adapted to deliver digital resources and online performances. This included a full programme of tutorials, interviews and concerts for a virtual Creative Jazz Orchestra Weekend in November; all films can be viewed on the DMA YouTube channel.

We have also used the past year to review and improve existing education programmes and devise new ones. We are particularly excited to launch a photography award in honour of Tony Nandi (pictured left) who, as one of the country's foremost photographers of the performing arts, chronicled DMA's work for some time before sadly passing away last November.

Our Summer Music School is scheduled for August and we plan to resume our weekly Music Centre in September; the latter will be expanded to include a 'Bold As' brass ensemble and an intergenerational vocal group.

Our schools 'Bold As' programme will also resume in September and introduce young players to brass instruments with a new learning booklet, support for peripatetic teachers and opportunities to play concerts in and out of school.

This autumn sees the launch of the National Youth Jazz Orchestra Regional Academy South-East in full partnership with NYJO. This is a prestigious addition to our educational offering and bring top quality jazz tuition to the region.

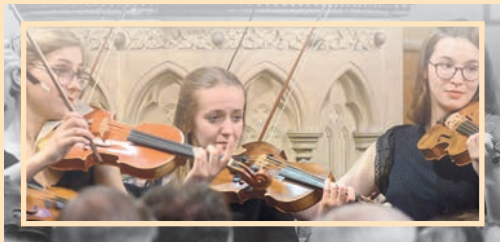

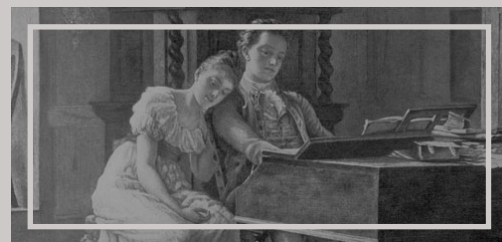
