The Summer School Music Director will prepare for and lead the weeklong, non-residential Summer School. The MD will report to DMA's Education Director and General Manager.

The successful candidate will be self-employed.

The Summer School Music Director's tasks will include:

- In consultation with the Education Director, develop a timetable for the annual Summer School.
- Liaise with sectional instrument tutors.
- Prepare a full programme of music for the course. This may include a newly composed piece by the Deal Festival composer in residence.
- Arrange musical parts for the various instruments.
- Brief the sectional instrument tutors and lead the Summer School full ensemble pieces.
- Conduct the end of week concert.
