In a year of firsts, we are delighted to welcome our inaugural Young Artist in Association, Lizzie Knatt (in partnership with the Royal Academy of Music) and our first Composer in Residence, Florence Anna Maunders, whose music and events you can encounter across what will be a jam-packed and phenomenal Deal Festival 2024.
